
Another fantastic Buick Driving Enthusiasts Fall Tour has made it into the history books.



The museum features galleries devoted to minerals, fossils, transportation technology, and hands-on science experiences.













The Great Locomotive Chase was a 1956 Walt Disney Productions adventure film based on the real Great Locomotive Chase that occurred in 1862 during the American Civil War. The film stars Fess Parker as James J. Andrews, the leader of a group of Union soldiers from various Ohio regiments who volunteered to go behind Confederate lines in civilian clothes, steal a Confederate train north of Atlanta, and drive it back to Union lines in Tennessee, tearing up railroad tracks and destroying bridges and telegraph lines along the way.



Thursday provided a excellant opportunity to gain knowledge about the inhabitants of the Etowah Indian Mounds. Home to several thousand Native Americans between 1000 A.D. to 1550 AD, the 54-acre site contains six earthen mounds, a plaza, village area, borrow pits and a defensive ditch. Excavation of the most intact Mississippian culture site in the southeastern United States and examining the artifacts revealed much about the people who lived here more than 500 years ago.

Congratulations to **Joe Taubitz**, **BDE #1**, who was presented with the coveted Harlow Curtis GM "Hometown" Memorial Trophy at Back to the Bricks 2019. It is awarded by the Mid-Michigan branch of the Society of Automotive Engineers and given to the car (and owner) that most represents the spirit of Harlow Curtice, the General Manager of AC Spark Plug. Curtis was transferred to Buick as General Manager and pulled Buick out of the recession with the highly successful 1934 40 series. This led Buick to regain it's leadership position.





This Unique 1962 Buick Motorhome Is Built From Four Buick Wagons by Michelle Marus - GM Authority - Feb 21, 2019

Here's something you don't find every day: an eight-wheeled Buick motorhome. Called the ShamRockAway, it was built in the 1960s by noted Buick enthusiast and RVer J. Dennis McGuire of Alma, Michigan.

The ShamRockAway was built from four 1962 Buick station wagons into one large, functional motorhome that's definitely a sight for sore eyes. As explained by the late creator, he "kept one wagon whole in the middle, split another in half, and welded the front and back on the one in center." There are also pieces from two





slogan in building the ShamRockAway: "Old Buicks never die – they just stack up." "Dad's creation surely brought many smiles to people's faces. That was dad. 




