

## It's Election Time . . .

The election of officers shall be at the National Tour. All members in good standing shall be given proper notice in the "Driving Force". In addition to the candidates presented by the nominating committee, any BDE member in good standing may nominate any other BDE member in good standing from the floor during the election process at the Annual Business Meeting for any elective office that currently requires a replacement officer. 
#### The Electra Rich Gibbs BDE #144

Officially it designated an Electra 4 Door Hardtop (Model 4739). My brother calls it the "Space Shuttle"...the winged rear fenders. My first view of the Electra was from our living room picture window, from above. That angle really accentuates the fender lines and overall style. I was eleven years old and thought the Electra was the wildest looking car I had ever seen. My grandparents, Fred and Lila Allen had just returned home from their annual stay in the Phoenix area during the worst winter weather. They had stopped by to drop off grapefruit and gifts from Arizona. I was just interested in the car.

When they left for Phoenix, they were driving a '57 Desert Beige Roadmaster 4-dr HT. Since new, the Roadmaster has given trouble with various issues and finally it developed one last problem that my grandfather would not put up with. He traded the Roadmaster for the Electra at Tony Coury Buick in Mesa, early January 1959. The Electra was on the showroom floor. It is equipped with the standard Electra accessories in addition to air-conditioning/automatic heaterdefroster and accessory groups that included 6-way power seat. Other options on the car are Wonder Bar radio with

I have been asked, "So, why all the Buicks?" I must be hereditary because my folks had a '34 Buick, Model 57 when they were married. They purchased a '55 Special Riviera Sedan new and drove it until 1970. My grandparents had a '38 Special Sedan which my grandfather used the engine and transmission to power a Lincoln arc welder; '42 Special Sedan that was purchased December 12, 1941 (I have the original sales document for this one), '52 Special Sedan, the '42 was traded for this car,'55 Special Riviera Sedan, '57 Roadmaster Riviera Sedan, the '59 Electra, '72 LeSabre Sedan and finally my grandmother's last car, an '85 Skylark Sedan. However, the '59 Electra stayed in the garage even

though the other Buicks were traded. Whenever I would visit my grandparents, I would go to the garage and sit in the Electra and admire the instrument panel layout.

In 1980 my grandfather and I agreed on a price and I purchased the Electra. I think he was saving it for me since he never sold it. I kept the car in their garage for over a year since I didn't have any place to store the car. I drove the car home in 1981 and had to store it outside since I didn't have a garage. I had no intention of restoring the Electra since it was still in good shape. It had a few "granny dents", but was presentable. In 1983, I had the Electra at my brother's place to re-work the brake system. While there, a tornado went through his neighborhood and damaged the Electra severely.

The body had to be repaired and repainted, windshield and rear window replaced and all chrome trim repaired or replaced. I started the repairs in fall of 1985 and finished the car in time for the 1986 BCA National in Indianapolis. This was my first BCA National meet. That same year I drove the Electra to my 20th high school reunion. I took my date to my high school graduation dance in the Electra.





So, what is that yellow Pontiac convertible (above center photo)? It's a '63 X-400, concept car that was built by GM Styling for the 1963 Auto Show Circuit to publicize the Pontiac brand. The engine is a supercharged Pontiac 421 that Pontiac had racer Mickey Thompson build. It's a four speed car. The car was used in two episodes of the My Three Son's TV show (black and white era) and displayed at the LA Auto Show and others. GM/Pontiac sold it to a dealer who sold it to a customer. It was driven hard for a number of years. Bill found it in the early 1980's and has been an ongoing restoration, with both of us working on it since the early 1980's with a great deal of the work happening 2006–2015. The X-400 was invited and displayed at Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance in March 2015.





Here is an original GM Photo showing the X-400 in the transport plane that GM/Pontiac used to fly the car from Detroit to LA for the LA Auto show and also the My Three Son's gig. Must be something about Pontiacs (so nice to ride in nice comfortable plane and avoid the traffic ) taking the easy way across country. After all "Buick's were made to be Driven." The GM guy had to ride in the X-400 on the cross country flight - no seats in a cargo plane - Bill had the opportunity to talk to him in the 1980's when he first bought the car.

One X-400 show car was built each year for 1959, 1960, 1962, 1963 and 1964. Only the

1963 and 1960 X-400s survive. GM Vice President of Styling Bill Mitchell supervised the construction of the 1963 X-400. It is understood that he and other executives used the car occasionally on the street. The car was exhibited by GM at the Los Angeles and Chicago Auto Shows.



**MONDAY, MAY 15:** Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore in Empire, MI. The 71,000 acre park includes the Hart visitor center & self directed Pierce Stocking 7.4 mile scenic drive within the park. The visitor center has a natural history museum & a slide presentation about the park. The park encompasses a 64 mile stretch of Lake Michigan's eastern coastline with forests, beaches, massive sand dunes, and 460 foot high bluffs. The park drive features stunning panoramas of the rolling dunes, Lake Michigan, & Glen Lake. Afterwards, participants can choose to have lunch in nearby Empire or Glen Arbor. Return on your own.

**TUESDAY, MAY 16:** Music House Museum: An extensive collection of the finest and rarest restored automated musical instruments. Located inside a complex of renovated farm buildings, the museum offers a 90 minute guided tour that explains & demonstrated the instruments that run on a continuous basis. We will then drive up Old Mission Peninsula to Chateau Chantal Winery where we will have a brief tour of the facilities. The winery is perched high atop the peninsula in one of the most scenic areas of the Great Lakes. Afterwards we will have lunch at a local restaurant. We will than continue on up the 20 mile long narrow peninsula to Old Mission Lighthouse, built in 1870, for a brief visit. The hilly peninsula juts out into Grand Traverse Bay, in places is less than a mile wide, & primarily consists of cherry orchards & wineries. Return on your own.

WED, MAY 17: Hagerty Garage tour: We will tour the facility in Traverse City which will include a brief presentation about Hagerty & light refreshments (coffee, fruit, bakery items). We will go to lunch in the area following the visit. After lunch, we will drive to Moomers, voted America's best ice cream shop in May 2008 by Good Morning America. There we will have a brief tour of the homemade ice cream shop, and an opportunity to enjoy your choice of 120 flavors of premium ice cream. This day will confirm the "BDE" stands for the Buick Driving & Eating club. After leaving Moomers, enjoy the sights of down town Traverse City on your own.

**THURSDAY, MAY 18:** Tunnel of Trees: This will be the longest drive day. We will drive north along Lake Michigan thru Petoskey to Harbor Springs where we will begin our famous 21 mile drive thru the "Tunnel of Trees" to Cross Village. This road is covered by overhanging maple & oak tree branches forming a tunnel over the rural, narrow, twisting paved road. Located in a beautiful park setting of mature trees & diverse public trails just minutes from downtown Traverse City. No formal tours or lunch. You will be on your own upon arrival at the Grand Traverse Commons.

That evening will be the banquet & farewell at our host hotel/resort.


