
From what started in Hot Springs, Arkansas 25 years ago, the BDE has grown to what it is today.





Dear Chapter Director,

The Buick Club of America (B.C.A.) in the last five years has changed completely from the organization I joined in 1969! The B.C.A., in the early years, was populated with members who drove and enjoyed their Buicks.

The early National Meets showed this, as the camaraderie and fellowship was much more evident, and the Buicks, though not all perfect, were driven to the meet.

With the introduction of the 400 point system and the Senior status, a subtle change has become increasingly evident. Restorers and investors, under the cloak of authenticity and originality have taken over our National show.

The backbone of the B.C.A. is the Chapter. The Chapter is made up of primarily people who drive and enjoy their Buicks, whether on a tour or an outing. It is the exception when an active chapter member places at a National meet.

A poll was taken at the Buicktown Chapter meeting on August 25, 1993 with 72 members present. It was unanimous that something be done to return our club to the membership and make our National fun again, rather than a tool for investors.

I too believe in originality and authenticity, and I know what must be done to make my cars right. T3 headlights, bias ply tires and tar top batteries are expensive. If the car is driven, regardless of articles in the Bugle to the contrary, the headlights and radial tires can be looked upon as safety items.

The judges handbook is very comprehensive and if a member wishes to do his car 100% properly, the information is there.

If you look at a recent issue of the Bugle, you will find ten other Buick Clubs listed. Four of these are on different continents, but six are on the North American continent and are spin offs of the B.C.A.

There are two other clubs not listed here! The Gran Sport Club of America and the Buick Street Rod Club.

The Studebaker Club went through a similar problem years ago and resolved it by becoming two distinct clubs! The Studebaker Owners Club and the Studebaker Drivers Club. Perhaps this is the way we should approach the problem.

I am asking you as Chapter Directors, to poll your members and see if they would be interested in a "Buick Drivers Club".

I would appreciate the results of the poll, both for and against, as quickly as possible.

As you undoubtly know, the Buicktown Chapter, because of our location, has very close ties with Buick Motor Division. If the "Buick Drivers Club" were headquartered here, I am sure we could count on Buick for support, as the driven cars are the ones the general public sees.

If we, the majority of the members, stand by and watch our National show become a display for the "trailer queens", then we deserve the consequences. 8 - Continued on Page 9

Please do not treat this problem lightly, as I believe it is time to let the National Board know who this club belongs to, and to whom they owe allegiance.

The B.C.A. is experiencing more and more difficulty in finding a Chapter that will host the National Meet. The main reason for this problem is the cost of the trophies and judges breakfast and pins. If we could show the National Board, the Chapters are solidly behind the drivers rather than the show cars perhaps the 'Buick Drivers Club" will not be necessary, and any Chapter can host a National that has on its agenda; tours, seminars, hospitality and fellowship.

Our Chapter just hosted the Great Lakes Regional. It was a non-judged show, but it had triple the cars and 5 times the vendors, that they had at the National in Phoenix.

Admittedly our location has something to do with this, but it still proves that a non-judged meet is a viable alternative to the 400 point shows.

The members who strive for "perfect" Buicks could attend seminars and perhaps have a panel of "judges" inspect his car He would then know immediately what was wrong. The system as it is today, requires the the car be judged, and the judging form be sent for, which takes 60 days plus, and then you try to figure out why the deductions were made.

I feel we should satisfy a larger portion of the membership, by reverting to what the B. C. A. was rather than continuing down the path it has chosen.

Enclosed is a stamped self-addressed envelope and a form. I would be very pleased if you would poll your membership regarding the direction the B.C.A. is moving, fill in the form and return it to me.

If the remaining Chapters feel as ours, I will have enough ammunition to at least let the National Board know they are not representing the majority of the members, but allowing a very aggressive minority to dictate the policies of the B.C.A.


