

# MEANANDERING MAYBERRY

Another plus of the BDE tours is the Early Bird Tour. But even before we headed to Winston-Salem for that event, we traveled back in time to Rockford, NC -home of Rockford General Store, where childhood "penny candy" is king, as well as familiar and obscure brands of soda in glass bottles. And just our luck, fried pies were fresh out of the skillet!



Having excess energy and consuming more junk than mom would approve of, we wandered southeast to Winston-Salem to visit a couple of the more unusual sights.


This single-story Shell station, in the shape of a giant scallop shelll, was built by R.H. Burton and his son, Ralph, in 1930 at Spague and Peachtree Streets. The

owners of the oil company decided to attract customers through a series of shell-shaped service sta-

tions. Eight were built, but this is the only one remaining.











landmark in Winston-Salem. It was created in 1858 by tinsmiths Julius and Samuel Mickey as an advertisement for their tin shop on South Main Street. The pot's original location on the curb caused it to be hit by wagons and cars. After the pot was damaged by a car in 1920, city officials attempted to keep the sign from being restored, as it was considered a safety hazard and illegal advertising. However, after local protest, the coffee pot was restored on a post farther from the street.





Mt. Airy Museum of Regional History and Dessert & Ghost Stories



Old Cranks Motorcar Museum



Thursday and Friday are full tour days. The main event for Thursday is the famous Warner Robbins Air Museum.


