On Monday, July 15 we headed to Canal Fulton, Ohio for a leisurely and educational trip down an original section of the historic Ohio and Erie Canal aboard the St. Helena III canal boat. When fully completed in 1832, the Ohio & Erie Canal travelled 308 miles through 146 lift locks on its path between Cleveland and Portsmouth. Ohio.

The St. Helena III is a replica of a freighter which voyaged along this canal more than 100 years ago. Laborers built her in 1989-1990 at the renovated McLaughlin Dry Dock, where original canal boats had been built and repaired.



It features a fully operational 18-stall reconstructed brick roundhouse and an outside 115-foot turntable, and also restoration facilities for locomotives, railroad cars, tools, and machinery and more. The collection includes steam and diesel engines, plus freight and passenger cars, which are available to tour for an additional fee. Founded by





Wednesday, September 25 featured the National Museum of Industrial History in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, housed in the former Electric Repair Shop of the Bethlehem Steel plant site. - av.

Tom, our docent, having worked in the steel industry, provided additional insight in to an already informative tour. The Bethlehem Steel Corporation was an American steelmaking company headquartered in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Until its closure in 2003, it was one of the world's largest steel-producing and shipbuilding companies

A section of the museum was dedicated to the silk mills, an industry that began in 1881 and thrived throughout the Second Industrial Revolution. By 1900, there were twenty-three silk establishments in the Lehigh Valley, making Pennsylvania the second largest producer of silk in the world.














A Car Collecting Fairytale

In the Spring/Summer 2024 issue of The Driving Force, my article was published about how, after looking for years for the right boat tail Buick Riviera, I wound up buying two of them 11 weeks apart. This is the story of how a children's fairytale may, or may not, have helped me find my Rivieras.

In this follow-up story, I have to briefly refer to Studebakers and Pontiacs, but I promise this article is about two Buicks.

In 1976 I owned a 1929 Studebaker and a 1951 Studebaker Commander Starlight Coupe (both of which I still own.) One day I was roaming through a salvage yard (junkyard) for parts for my '51. While there, I came upon 1959 Pontiac Bonneville and recalled that back when I was 10 or 11 years old, I had seen a new 1959 Pontiac and I thought it was the best-looking car I had ever seen and wished I could have one...someday.

On that June day in 1976 at the salvage yard, I was at a point in my life where my wife and I had a 15-month-old baby and were seven months pregnant with our second child. In addition, I was very early in my career. For these reasons, it seemed to me that the chance I would ever own a '59 Pontiac was quite remote.

So, on a whim, I bought the horn ring off of the scrapped 1959 Pontiac. I had always thought that horn ring was very artistic. I went home and being limited on funds, I cut a piece of cardboard and mounted the horn ring on it to hang on the wall of my garage and wrote on it that it was my "glass slipper". This was a reference to the children's fairytale, Cinderella, in which they were trying to find the person whose foot fit into the slipper. In my case, I was hoping that one day I might own the car that the horn ring fit.

I noted the date I bought the horn ring on the back of the cardboard. It was June 5, 1976.

Years and decades went by. Finally in 2011, I was fortunate enough to find and purchased a 1959 Pontiac Bonneville convertible.

As I recounted in my article in The Driving Force, I looked for years to find the right boat tail Riviera with no success.

Eventually, I joined the Riviera Owners Association, hoping their magazine might lead me to the car I was looking for.

In the second issue of their magazine, "The Riview", that I received (January/February 2021), I found an ad from someone in Athens, Georgia who was offering a rear window for a boat tail Riviera for free. Since Athens is only about an hour away from our home, I emailed the person to see if the window was still available. He indicated it was and that I was welcome to come get it but he also asked what year Riviera I had.

I would not lie to the man and so I briefly recounted the story you are reading here. I thought he might think I was a kook and I might never hear back from him. However, he responded that it was a great story and that I was welcome to come get the window.

As with the horn ring for the Pontiac, I was hoping to find a 1971 or 1972 Riviera the rear glass would window fit.

I retrieved the window in April, 2021. Once I got it home, I cleaned it up, printed a label "Glass Slipper Number 2" and hoped all this might bring me good luck in finding the Riviera I had been seeking for so many years.


Eleven months later, I had a 1971 Riviera in my garage and 11 weeks after that I had a second boat tail (1972) in my garage also.
